Great Sand Dunes National Park

Educational Activity Overview: Before you visit Great Sand Dunes National Park, explore this amazing National Park and Preserve's <u>website</u>. Once in the Park, your first stop should be the visitors center to check out the interactive exhibits and view a short 20-minute video. Don't forget to pick out a Be a Junior Ranger booklet or backpack at the Visitor's Center for even more activities.

Kids will build a sequence chart for this activity. A sequence chart helps kids understand the order of events. Beginning in the first box, write or draw the first event that happened to make the sand dunes, and then next, and so on. <u>Find the answers here</u>.

Activity: Before heading out to enjoy a sled down the dunes or dipping your toes in Medano Creek, create a sequence chart to understand how the dunes were formed in the first place.
