The Highway of Legends, La Veta

Educational Activity Overview: Buildings that are still standing one hundred years after they are built are important to the community for several reasons. Become an architectural detective during a walking tour of La Veta.

Background: Fort Francisco was built by Colonel John Francisco in 1862, as a plaza for his ranch headquarters. The town was later renamed La Veta when the railroad came through. La Veta means "the vein" in Spanish.

Take a walking tour of La Veta. Download the Travelstorys app (https://travelstorys.com) and search for "Historic La Veta" to take the walking tour. During the tour, pay special attention to the buildings around you and select a few (2-3) of your favorites in order to complete the following activity.
